This paper analyses the general state of relations of Azerbaijan with its largest and geopolitically most important neighbors as well as with other international players in order to see how Azerbaijan is able to maintain a balanced approach in foreign policy, maneuvering politically between the clashing geopolitical interests and ambitions of the different states in the South Caucasus. Hosting COP29 is absolute significant nuance for Baku embracing all world under climate change to Azerbaijan and spinning political and economic network alongside with multilateral regional diplomacy in the region. The economic growth of China leads its economy to supply goods not only via the sea and air trafficking, but also through the trans-Caspian way to Europe. In this regard, Within the New Silk Road Initiative Azerbaijan and China could accelerate some new bilateral and trade partnership. Furthermore, this new project not only makes Azerbaijan as a regional key factor in Caucasus but also in Trans Caspian area. And it would cause nations integration in whole region of this new project. Azerbaijan could get its new role in this project to play an essential role on Global Trade as a transit country. Many scholars argued that, due to its choices to foreign policy and strong focus to effective development of its economy, Azerbaijan vies to maintain an independent course. And this paper basically analyses Azerbaijan's political, economic approaches to Global and Regional Powers as well as its views to China as a new Global actor in its region, and impacts of The New Silk way Project at Azerbaijan-China Relations.

Under the Haydar Aliyev Azerbaijan have gained some credits from most of the western countries for an investment for Baku's fossil energy resources and via this "Oil Diplomacy" Azerbaijan guaranteed its early period of Sovereignty after the gaining Independence. BP, Chevron, Total, Exxon and some other oil companies started their businesses in Baku and it was clear signal to all world Azerbaijan economically and invest friendly country. The correct implementation of foreign policy towards regional as well as global powers exceptionally important for Azerbaijan. Due to, its complex geostrategic location between West and East produce naturally geoeconomic and geopolitical interests. Besides Azerbaijan protecting its national interests and the status of leading country in the region Baku is attempting to establish mutually beneficial relations with West, Islamic countries, The Turkic world, CIS countries as well as with China.

And thanks to this, the international community benefited from the ancient Chinese civilization: "We see this project as a cooperation, partnership and mutual prosperity that can bring prosperity to the countries along the route. Azerbaijan, located between the Caspian Sea and the Black Sea, is a natural connection connecting Central Asia and Europe," said H. Hajiyev said.

The transition to "green energy", which is one of the challenges of the modern era, can further strengthen China-Azerbaijani relations. China is one of the world leaders in purchasing energy from renewable sources. Making transition to "green energy" a priority area, Azerbaijan also partners with Chinese companies in this direction. China pays attention to Azerbaijan's clean energy reforms and highly appreciates the country's efforts towards ecological development. Currently, areas are selected for the construction of solar power plants with a Chinese company in Fuzuli. China's advanced manufacturing industry is famous all over the world. This means the end of the West's monopoly on technology.

Chinese companies are aware of the investment promotion measures implemented by Azerbaijan to promote infrastructure construction and improve the investment and business environment in the territories liberated from occupation. Chinese companies have gone on inspection trips to conduct research and have participated in projects such as supplying test equipment for "smart villages" and airports. Currently, some enterprises are actively promoting the investment and construction projects of photovoltaic power plants to help develop the local green economy. China is actively ready to promote and collaborate with Azerbaijan for Green Economy and indeed is one of the strategic partners in the region. Recent Chinese companies' activities in the Karabakh region is clear resemble of Beijing's support and clear partnership with Baku. China is eagerly applause to speeding up connections and modernizing infrastructure and services along the Trans-Caspian International Transport Corridor. China attaches great importance to the favorable geographical location of the "Middle Corridor" and positively evaluates its importance in strengthening regional relations, promoting regional economic development, and ensuring the stability of global industrial and logistics chains. The joint construction of "One Belt, One Road" fully corresponds to the "Middle Corridor" concept. In the field of transport communications, China and the region countries located along the "One Belt, One Road", including Azerbaijan, have common interests on this project.

Meanwhile, China is committed to speeding up connectivity along the Trans-Caspian International Transport Corridor, improving infrastructure and services, increasing the volume of China-Europe rail freight, easing and removing barriers to regional and international supply chains. The Chinese side is also willing to strengthen cultural and humanitarian ties, promote relations between the business, academic and non-governmental sectors of the two countries, and strengthen and diversify the social base to deepen bilateral cooperation.

Based on that strategic approach, several sources for energy production have been identified in the Green Energy Zone, and negotiations are underway with foreign companies in the fields of electricity generation from renewable energy sources, use of electric vehicles, construction of solar panels, and the application and management of smart energy technologies. Among that business community, Chinese companies are also in the main line. Currently, China

is the world's leading country in the production of electricity from renewable sources, twice ahead of its closest competitor, the United States. In 2023, China's electricity generation from renewable sources has reached 1,000 gigawatts, which is 43.5 percent of the country's total generating capacity potential. About 40 percent of the world's renewable energy potential is provided by China, and in 2030 this number is expected to reach 44 percent.




Figure 1: China, electricity generation in 2023
